CHRISTMAS ON THE GO



Every year, I start the season of Advent thinking, this year Christmas will be less hectic than last year. That the tree will be ordered, collected and decorated in plenty of time; all presents will be wrapped by 23rd December; the Christmas cards will be

written and posted before the New Year (no time for unrealistic ambitions); and, of course, this year, we will not be tempted to buy too much food! This year, as in previous years, there is a strong likelihood that at least one of the things on my to-do list will keep me busy until the very last moment, or something will happen that will require me to abandon the list altogether and hurriedly write a new one.

There is a slight sense of frustration when Christmas fails to match the lavish promises spread out before us on TV adverts. The ones where you see families spend the whole day relaxing in front of the fire, after a meal where nothing was burnt, undercooked or overcooked, and when the dishes miraculously take care of themselves, with everybody constantly happy and full of smiles. The only truly amazing thing about such expectations is how we can fall into believing this "false Christmas myth", a myth that helps to empty our pockets of much money while putting a strain on our relationships with those we love.

In the carol sung by the field mice, Kenneth Grahame described in his book *Wind in the Willows* how the joy of Christmas comes to us from different place than the place of comfort:

Villagers, all, this frosty tide, let your doors swing open wide, though wind may follow, and snow beside, yet draw us in by your fire to bide; Joy shall be yours in the morning!

If Christmas keeps us busier than we would like, and even turns our lives upside down, we find ourselves in good company. The real Christmas is one big travel show, taking us to an unlikely place, meeting unlikely people, and God among them in a way that sounds strange to us still more than 2000 years later.

The first to get up and go were the three wise men from the East. They set out at "just the worst time of the year" as T.S. Eliot put it. From Matthew's gospel, we know that Joseph was not only inconvenienced by the news that his fiancée was pregnant but, against his better instinct, he was asked to pack their bags to set off into an uncertain future. Not to mention Mary, who had a revelation that her life would never be the same again once she agreed to let God into her life. The angels did not have a quiet moment either; they were constantly taking messages to all sorts of people. And then there was the star that appeared in the sky, disappeared, and appeared again. It must have taken the shepherds a lot of convincing to get up and go, and leave their sheep at night in a field unprotected.

If God moves down from heaven to earth on Christmas night, how can we resist moving and being moved?

For ere one half of the night was gone, sudden a star has led us on, raining bliss and benison — bliss tomorrow and more anon, Joy for every morning!

May you discover this Christmas that which moves your heart, what bids you joy, not just for a public holiday, but every new morning from thereon,
