Dear Friends

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for the warmth of your welcome to Wardie. You have made it easy for me to settle into my role as locum with you, and I am

looking forward to working alongside you in the interim period until the appointment of your next minister.

I thought I would take this opportunity of telling you a wee bit about myself and our family. I was born in the village of Twechar and lived there until I was about seven when we moved into the neighbouring town of Kilsyth and remained there until I was married.

I attended Kilsyth Academy, left school after fourth year and worked for six years with the South of Scotland Electricity Board in Glasgow. I spent the next four years at London Bible College studying theology before entering the Baptist ministry, serving High Blantyre, Drumchapel and Duncan Street Baptist Churches.

While at Drumchapel the way opened for me to complete my social work course at Jordanhill College. The church at Drumchapel allowed me to continue to work on a part-time basis for the duration of my time at college and to work as a social worker for a couple of years after graduation. I was then invited by the Baptist Union to work as a community minister linked to Hillhead and Adelaide Place Baptist Churches in Glasgow, having responsibility for the running of Elpis Centre, a rehabilitation facility of teenage girls and five small flats occupied by homeless men. Duncan Street followed this appointment. After my ministry there I returned to social work — first of all at Gogarburn Hospital before working with the elderly.

Marion and I met on Seaside Mission at Ardrossan. At that time we both belonged to Congregational Churches — Priesthill in Glasgow and Kilsyth. We were married in 1961 and have three children: Fiona, who along with her partner Gary are in social work — they live here in Edinburgh; Allister, also a social worker, is married to Patsy and they live in Peebles and have provided us with four grandchildren; Sheila is married to David, a farmer, and they with their three boys live in Letham in Angus. Sheila has a learning support teaching post in a school in Arbroath.


